- Provide broad spectrum of services in Rockingham County including MOW's and Meals with Friends, Adult Day Care Services, Transportation
- Lead Agency for CAP/DA services in Rockingham County
- Lead COE in Piedmont Triad CRC, to provide Options Counselors as needed
- Provide Transition Coordination under MFP as needed

What is ADTS' role?

- **State Demonstration Project to assist people who live in impatient facilities to move into their own communities**
- **To support North Carolinians to have greater choice about where they receive long-term supports**
- **To help identify and address barriers to receiving quality community-based, long-term care and supports**
- **Funded by Medicaid dollars through a partnership between NC's DMA and the federal agency CMS**

**Money Follows the Person:
What is it?**

- **Community-Based Funding for supports:** Participants receive personal support and other services through Medicaid's Community Alternatives Program (CAP) or the PACE Program
- **Transition "Start-Up" Funding:** Participants may be eligible for up to \$3000 in order to secure items needed in transition
- **More Options in Long-Term Support:** Participation in completely voluntary. The project simply provides residents of inpatient facilities and option to receive services and supports in their communities
- **Transition Coordination Services (Where available)**

**MFP: What are the
benefits?**

- Have lived in a hospital, SNF or ICF for people with developmental disabilities for at least three months AND
- Meet the CAP program eligibility requirements AND
- Be receiving Medicaid services before the transition AND
- Choose to move to a “qualified residence”
