SUBJECT: Release of SCCRS Edits

EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2014

Effective October 1, 2014 new system edits have been released in the Subsidized Child Care Reimbursement System (SCCRS). These changes support the Subsidized Child Care Program policy changes made in response to recent legislation in the 2014 Budget Bill.

Division of Child Development and Early Education (DCDEE) staff provided training on these policy changes in late August and early September. Policy changes include income eligibility and parental fee changes. Income eligibility limits have changed from 75% FPL adjusted for family size to 200% of FPL adjusted for family size for children through 5 years of age and all children with special needs. For typically developing children 6-12, the 2014 income eligibility guideline is based upon 133% FPL adjusted for family size. Policy changes affect parental fees by discontinuing proration of the parental fee based upon family size and/or plan of care hours.

To support the new policies and assist with the correct entry of information into the SCCRS, the new system edits affect the entry of income and parental fee amounts. Income will be compared to eligibility ending dates to determine when income is within limits. Parental fees will be compared to income. Specific information is provided on Attachment 1. Please share this information with the child care staff, especially those in your agency who key reimbursement into the SCCRS.
